

But it could have been a large group, including several wise men plus their servants and bodyguards. A trip through foreign countries was dangerous, so it was safer to have a caravan.

CLAIM TO FAME



They saw a special star in the night sky. As astronomers, they consulted Scripture and other writings, then traveled to Israel to bring gifts to the newborn King, Jesus.

The wise men might have seen a comet, an alignment of planets or stars, or a miraculous light that made them believe a great king had been born. Whatever it was, it must have been highly unusual to motivate them to pack up and travel to a faraway country.

They asked a very jealous king where his replacement king was born. Little did they know that King Herod would want to kill any rival rulers. When they followed the star into Israel, they naturally went to the capital, Jerusalem, and asked advice from the king. Herod's scholars pointed to Micah 5:2, which said the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem. After visiting young Jesus, the wise men were warned in a dream not to tell Herod where they had found the child, and it took awhile before Herod found out they got away.

The wise men presented Jesus and His parents with gifts of gold, frankincense (incense that smells good when burned), and myrrh (expensive perfume). Fragrances were popular and expensive gifts in Bible times.
