## Kids with Disabilities

Psalm 146:7-8

When my child told me about another student in his class whose “brain doesn’t work like other kids’ brains,” I asked more about it. I discovered there are students who leave the classroom to receive support from special education teachers. But when they’re in the classroom they participate with the rest of the students. When I commented how great it was for him and other students to include this boy he simply said, “Mom, they’re just like us when we play at recess. And they need friends, too.” I tell him how glad I am for his attitude. **God loves each of us. He made us different. Some differences make school harder. But that doesn’t make us any less. We’re all unique creations of God.**

### Try This:

After having a family over for dinner one day, I discovered that they were extra appreciative because people didn’t often invite them—they have a couple of kids who have disabilities. We recognized that God had put us together with this family, and made it a point to continue the friendship between the families. The bonus? Our kids learned a lot about being good friends to all kinds of children.
